Stagnant Water

Health Risks

- Lead
- Pathogenic bacteria
- Legionella





Short-term (immediate)

- 1. Assessment of the plumbing
- 2. Flush out stagnant water
- 3. Clean or replace aerators
- 4. Replace filters
